This is a fun filled weekend intended to help the Webelos Scout fulfill requirements towards earning their Outdoorsman, Forester, and Naturalist Activity Pins.

Pre-registration is appreciated so that staff can plan ahead for the number of boys attending.

Friday night you can arrive between 4-7 PM, at which time you will register and set up your camp site. Staff will hold a Camp Fire (Crew 444) later that night.

Saturday the program starts at 9AM and will end at about 6PM. The Webelos will have a camp fire that night at which time each Pack should have a song and a skit to present.

This Weekend is run just like a Boy Scout Camporee. **Which means you will need to bring everything that you will need for the weekend.** This includes food, tents, Tarps, cooking equipment, and personal gear. If you don't bring it, you won't have it. Also any trash that you accumulate during the weekend must be taken with you when you leave. This includes campfire ashes. This is a great opportunity to work closely with a Boy Scout troop to borrow equipment you will need and to help plan for the weekend.

If you plan on having a Camp Fire or Cooking Fire it must be in a self contained barrel and off the ground.

This is a Boy Scout of America backed program. All BSA policy's will be followed which means each Scout spending the night must have an Adult partner.

Session 1

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Open your session with the Boy Scout Motto and Law. Discuss the meaning of each.
- ❖ Explain the rules of safe hiking, both on the highway and cross-country. (Boy Scout handbook pages 38 to 39)
- ❖ Explain what to do if lost. (Boy Scout handbook pages 40 to 41)
- ❖ Explain poisonous plants found in our area. (Boy Scout handbook page 59)

Session 2

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Open your session by reading the Outdoor Code and explain.
- ❖ Showing the life history of a tree. (Forester requirement number three) Show how water and minerals help a tree grow. (Forester requirement number four ~ Webelos book pages 338,339 and 340)
- ❖ Describe the causes and harm of wild fires. (Webelos book pages 343 to 344)
- ❖ Explain the rules of outdoor fire safety. (Webelos book page 406)

Session 3

Adult Leader: _____

- ❖ Open your session pointing out special parts of the Webelos uniform.
- ❖ Demonstrate how to raise, lower, display, and fold the United State of America flag. (Webelos book pages 160 to 164)
- ❖ Give a brief history of the flag of the United States of America.

Session 4

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Open your session with the Scout Oath and the Scout sign and explain each.
- ❖ Knots demonstrate and let the scouts tie the following knots: square knot, bowline, clove hitch, and two half hitches, and tautline hitch. (Outdoorsman requirement number one Webelos book pages 397 to 398)

Session 5

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Open your session by explaining the buddy system.
- ❖ Cover simple first aid using the Boy Scout handbook and Webelos handbook.

Session 6

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Open your session with the scout handshake and explain why we use the left hand.
- ❖ Whittling Chip ~ Hold a class for Webelos to earn their Whittling Chip cards. Give cards to leaders at cracker barrel Saturday night. This will limit the use of pocket knives. Bear book.

This part of the program is for the new Webelos Scout. It will help him meet requirements in his Webelos book.

- ❖ Make camp gadgets using lashings.

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Hands on fire building talking about different types of fires and their uses.
- ❖ Explain the rules of outdoor fire safety. (Webelos book page 406)

Session 5

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Demonstrate the Heimlich maneuver and tell when to use it. (Boy Scout handbook pages 296 to 297)
- ❖ Demonstrate how to treat simple cuts and scratches. (Boy Scout handbook page 304)
- ❖ Illustrate what to do for blisters on the hand and foot. (Boy Scout handbook page 308)
- ❖ Discuss how to treat minor burns and scalds. (Boy Scout handbook pages 306 to 307)
- ❖ Talk about bites and stings of insects and ticks. (Boy Scout handbook pages 310 to 311)
- ❖ Discuss poisonous snakebite. (Boy Scout handbook pages 312 to 313)
- ❖ Show what to do for a nosebleed. (Boy Scout handbook page 306)

Session 6

Adult Leader _____

- ❖ Demonstrate the different backpacks and how to pack and carry one.
- ❖ Discuss the camp gear needed for a weekend camping trip, the clothing needed, and the proper method of dressing for weather conditions.

This part of the program is to expose the Webelos Scout to, and prepare him for the Tenderfoot rank advancement requirements. Exposing the Webelos Scout to these requirements now, will only help him receive his Tenderfoot board of review shortly after joining a troop. The better we prepare a Webelos Scout in his second year, the better prepared Boy Scout you will receive upon bridging from Cub Scouts to Boy Scouts.
